

Guidance on Types of Organisations

There are a few questions in our funding applications that will need you to identify what type of organisation your current, or future organisation is. To help you determine the correct type of organisation, we have provided the following guidance.

Where your organisation falls into one or more of these categories, please select the option which aligns closest to your organisation's primary activities.

We recognise that for Non-UK Applicants the organisation definitions will vary country to country. Therefore, Non-UK applicants should select the organisation type which aligns closest to your organisation's primary activities. The options are: Non-UK Company, Non-UK Charity or Not for Profit, Non-UK Public Sector Organisations or Non-UK Academic or Research Institutes.

Type of Organisation	Definition
UK Company	To be considered a UK company, the organisation must be registered with <u>Companies</u> <u>House</u> .
Not for Profit or UK Charity	This option includes: Research organisations. Catapult Centres, as listed here . UK Registered Charities, which must be registered with the Charities Commission .



	Community Interest Companies (CICs), which must be registered with either Companies House, or the Office of the Regulator of Community Interest Companies.
UK Public Sector Organisations	This option includes: • Departmentals, Agencies & Public Bodies as listed here. • Local authorities or other public sector organisations.
UK Academic or Research Institutes	This option includes: Higher Education Institutes (HEIs). Learned societies. Research institutes.
